<u>The Filling and Fullness</u> of the Holy Spirit in Acts

Verb: pimplemi - To fill

These passages from <u>Acts</u> emphasize the <u>event</u> rather than the state of fullness:

<u>2:4</u> - And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit...

- $\underline{4:8}$ Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them...
- <u>4:31</u> ...and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit,
- <u>9:17</u> receive your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit...
- <u>13:9</u> Then Saul,..., filled with the Holy Spirit...
- No conditions were required for this filling. The Holy Spirit came upon the people sovereignly.

Adjective: pleres - Full of

These passages emphasize the ministry of the Spirit:
<u>6:3</u> - ...seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom...

<u>6:5, 7:55</u> - ...Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit

 $\underline{11:24}$ - For he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit & of faith

Verses are descriptive of one who is characterized by the <u>quality</u> of spirituality.

Verb: pleroo - To fill; to fill up

<u>13:52</u> - And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit.

<u>The Differences between</u> <u>Spirit Anointing and Spirit Baptism</u>

Spirit Anointing	Spirit Baptism
Christ at His Baptism	Christ after His Ascension
The Apostles on Resurrection Day	The Apostles at Pentecost
Limited to Christ and the Apostles	For all the Partakers of The New Covenant
For Administrative Leadership	For Spiritual Blessings

Special Filling Contrasted with Normal Filling

<u>Pimplemi</u>

8 uses

Usually a verb

Usually aorist passive

Emphasizes an event

No Conditions

Sovereign bestowal

Unsought power

Recurring

Repeated for a task, not because of sin

Enablement for a spiritual task

Unusual

<u>Pleroo</u>

6 uses (including adj. & verb forms) Usually an adjective

Imperfect or present passive in verb form Emphasizes an attitude

Implied conditions

Preexisting disposition

Abiding spirituality

Progressively more apparent

Often indicates Christian maturity

Multifaceted implications for spirituality

Intended to be normal
