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### Introduction

od's great purpose is to "gather together in one all things in Christ" (Ephesians 1:10). God will fulfill every detail of this divine purpose through the ministry of Jesus Christ as Savior and King. When you come to the final book in the Bible, the Book of the Revelation, certain aspects of the plan of God are declared to be still in the future. Even in this book, the focus of the revelation is on Jesus Christ and His ministry in fulfillment of all the promises of God.

God's great plan in Jesus Christ commenced with the giving of promises in the Old Testament. For example, consider the prospect of the faithful prophets of old who revealed, proclaimed, and believed the Word of God. What did they expect from the plan of God? As the prophets faithfully studied the Word, they anticipated a coming seed of the woman who would bruise Satan's head, even as Satan bruised His heel. They believed that God would give the land of Canaan from the Egyptian River to the great Euphrates River to the Seed. They expected a kingdom, a continuation of David's throne, which would endure forever in the presence of God. This kingdom would be characterized by the righteousness of a holy God.

As the promises of old spoke of great things to come, the question then remained as to when these promises would be fulfilled. Toward the end of Old Testament history, the kingdom of Israel was facing decline and destruction. Again God spoke through His prophets. The great promises of the past would not be lost in impending judgment of the nation. For example, listen to the words of Jeremiah to the doomed nation: "Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will raise unto David a righteous Branch, and a King shall reign and prosper, and shall execute judgment and justice in the earth. In his days Judah shall be saved, and Israel shall dwell safely: and this is his name whereby he shall be called, THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS" (Jeremiah 23:5-6).

In addition, God declared to Jeremiah His purpose to make a New Covenant with the house of Israel and Judah, not like the Old Covenant which they broke, but a Covenant to be written upon their hearts so that they would know the Lord. As these words were heard and studied, it was seen that the promises of God were not finally fulfilled in the Old Testament, but remained for a yet future time. The teachings of Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, and the minor prophets spoke of great hope for the coming days. But the question remained as to when these promises would be fulfilled. Believing Israel awaited the coming of Messiah, anticipating the fulfillment of this hope in His day.

The Gospel writers revealed the ministry of Jesus Christ as the Messiah. He came preaching the Gospel of the Kingdom. He fulfilled His ministry, died on the cross, and rose again from the dead. After this, when He met with His disciples just before His ascension, they again

raised the issue that was the expectation of the Old Testament saints: "Lord, wilt thou at this time restore again the kingdom to Israel?" (Acts 1:6). The Lord replied, "It is not for you to know the times or the seasons, which the Father hath put in His own power" (Acts 1:7). Having said that, the Lord spoke concerning the church and then ascended into heaven. On the following Day of Pentecost, He sent His Spirit to establish the church.

Perhaps it may be concluded that the promises of old are fulfilled in Christ and the church as He reigns in the hearts of His people. This would be possible were it not for the very specific nature of the Old Testament promises, the recorded teaching of Jesus Christ about the last days, and the prophetic teaching of the new Testament writers. One New Testament book which is of particular significance is the Book of the Revelation. Here we find the general answer to the disciples' question. John, writing sometime during the last decade of the first century, spoke of the Day of the Lord, the return of the Lord, a thousand-year reign of the Lord, and declared these great events to be still in the future. This places the Christian in the midst of the fulfillment of God's great promises. As the Christian points to the past, the suffering Savior is seen accomplishing our salvation. This is the spiritual foundation for the righteous kingdom of God. And yet, the Christian also looks forward to the final consummation of human history in the judgment of the nations and the reign of Jesus Christ in righteousness on the earth. It is the Book of the Revelation that places the plan of God in proper perspective for the Christian in the church.

When John began the Book of the Revelation, he immediately declared the general contents of this communication from God. It is "The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave unto him, to shew unto his servants things which must shortly come to pass" (Rev. 1:1). Some believe that the outline of this revelation is indicated by the Lord when He declared to John, "Write the things which thou hast seen (chapter 1: the vision of Christ), and the things which are (chapters 2-3: the letters to the seven churches), and the things which shall be hereafter (chapters 4-22: the great tribulation, the coming of the Lord, the millennial reign of Christ, and the eternal state)" (Revelation 1:19).

The Book of the Revelation reaffirms for us that the promises of God will all be fulfilled in the literal return of Christ to reign upon the earth. The Christian joins with the Old Testament saints in expecting Christ to fulfill the prophetic word of the Old Testament prophets. The necessary work of redemption was accomplished in the first coming of Christ and now we await with eager expectation that Day when God will be faithful to His Word and bring all things together in Christ in His Kingdom of righteousness upon the earth.



# Notes on "The Book of The Revelation of Jesus Christ" L. Dwight Custis October, 1984

- 1. The writer: the Apostle John (Rev. 1:1, 4, 9; 21:2; 22:8).
- 2. The place of writing: the Isle of Patmos in the Aegean Sea where John had been exiled because his ministry of the Word of God (Rev. 1:9).
- 3. The time of writing: probably the last of all of the New Testament books, about 95 or 96 A.D., during the persecution by the Roman Emperor, Domitian.
- 4. The original destination of the book:
  - a. The seven churches of the Roman province of Asia, located in what is now the country of Turkey (Cf. Rev. 1:4, 11; 2; 3; 22:16). Note their location on the Bible lands map on page 31.
  - b. Thus, the book is primarily for believers.
- 5. The purposes of the book:
  - a. The primary purposes are stated in Rev. 1:1-3. They are twofold:
    - 1) "The revelation of Jesus Christ."
    - 2) Concerning "things which must shortly come to pass." Thus it is a book in which future events are revealed.
  - b. Reassurance and encouragement.
    - 1) John wrote during a time of persecution. Persecution often produces both discouragement and even spiritual declension. People were undoubtedly asking, "What will the outcome be?"
    - 2) Note the reassurance in 1:3, 8, 11, 17, 18.
    - 3) The Lord's commendation in the letters to the churches was reassuring.
    - 4) As one reads the book and notes the details of the coming events culminating in the return of Christ to the earth (Rev. 19), the reader realizes that in spite of all the opposition of men, nations, and even Satan himself, God's purposes will be carried out completely, resulting in the establishing of a new heaven and a new earth. This gives great encouragement.
  - c. Warning. As noted above, persecution sometimes leads to declension. The prevalence of evil often causes believers to get careless about their lives. To prevent such declension from developing, the book contains warnings. See Rev. 2:4, 5, 14-16, 20-23 as examples of warnings.
  - d. Evangelism. Although the book is written primarily for believers, Rev. 22:17 makes it clear that some may be expected to receive Christ as Savior as a result of reading and hearing the truths of this book.

# The Outline of "The Book of The Revelation of Jesus Christ" L. Dwight Custis October, 1984

Revelation 1:19 gives the major division of the book. In a general way these are:

- 1. "The things which thou (meaning, the Apostle John) hast seen" (Rev. 1).
- 2. "The things which are" -- the letters to the seven churches (Rev. 2, 3).
- 3. "The things which shall be hereafter" (Rev. 4-22).

The following is a more detailed outline:

- I. INTRODUCTION (Revelation 1:1-8).
  - A. The title and description (1:1-2).
  - B. The benediction (1:3).
  - C. The salutation (1:4-8).
- II. THE THINGS WHICH JOHN HAD SEEN: the vision of Christ as the Son of man and as a Judge (Revelation 1:9-20).
- III. "THE THINGS WHICH ARE": the letters to the seven churches of Asia (Revelation 2:1-3:22).
  - A. The church at Ephesus (2:1-7): the church that had lost her first love.
  - B. The church at Smyrna (2:8-11): the suffering church, materially poor, but spiritually rich.
  - C. The church at Pergamos (2:12-17): where Satan's seat was, contaminated by the doctrine of the Nicolaitanes.
  - D. The church at Thyatira (2:18-29): the church where the false prophetess Jezebel was permitted to continue her evil work.
  - E. The church at Sardis (3:1-6): the church which had a good name, but spiritually was dead.
  - F. The church at Philadelphia (3:7-13): the church of the open door.
  - G. The church at Laodicea (3:14-22): the lukewarm church, materially rich, but spiritually poor.
- **IV.** "THE THINGS WHICH SHALL BE HEREAFTER" (Revelation 4:1-22:5). This includes those things that will take place from the beginning of the Great Tribulation until the Eternal State is established with the new heaven and new earth.
  - A. The Throne in Heaven (Rev. 4:1-5:14).
    - 1. God upon His throne, worshiped by the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures (4:1-11).
    - 2. God with the scroll with seven seals (5:1-14). The Lamb is the only One Who is worthy to open the seals. He takes the scroll from God, and then is worshiped as God was worshiped in chapter 4.
  - B. The Great Tribulation (Rev. 6:1-19:10).
    - 1. THE JUDGMENT OF THE SEVEN SEALS (Rev. 6:1-8:6).
      - a. The first seal (6:1-2).
      - b. The second seal (6:3-4).
      - c. The third seal (6:5-6).
      - d. The fourth seal (6:7-8).
      - e. The fifth seal (6:9-11).
      - f. The sixth seal (6:12-17).

### Parenthesis:

- (1) Rev. 7:1-8. The redeemed of Israel who are spared from death during the Great Tribulation --the 144,000.
- (2) Rev. 7:9-17. A heavenly vision of the saints who are martyred during the Great Tribulation. Both Jews and Gentiles are included in this number.
- g. The seventh seal (8:1-6). This leads to the second series of judgments.

- 2. THE SEVEN TRUMPET JUDGMENTS (Rev. 8:7-11:19).
  - a. The first trumpet (8:7).
  - b. The second trumpet (8:8-9).
  - c. The third trumpet (8:10-11).
  - d. The fourth trumpet (8:12-13).
  - e. The fifth trumpet--the first woe (9:1-12).
  - f. The sixth trumpet--the second woe (9:13-21).

### Parenthesis:

- (1) The mighty angel with the little book (10:1-11).
- (2) The two witnesses (11:1-14).
- g. The seventh trumpet--the third woe (11:15-19).
- 3. The woman, the child, and the great dragon, that old serpent called the Devil and Satan (12:1-17).
- 4. The two beasts (13:1-18).
- 5. The song of the 144,000 (14:1-5).
- 6. The vision of the six angels and the Son of man (14:6-20). Three angels appear, then the Son of man, and then the last three angels. With the exception of the fifth angel, all of the rest have a message to proclaim.
- 7. THE SEVEN VIAL, OR BOWL, JUDGMENTS (Rev. 15:1-16:21).
  - a. The preparation for the seven bowl judgments (15:1-16:1).
  - b. The first bowl (16:2).
  - c. The second bowl (16:3).
  - d. The third bowl (16:4-7).
  - e. The fourth bowl (16:8-9).
  - f. The fifth bowl (16:10-11).
  - g. The sixth bowl (16:12-16)
  - h. The seventh bowl (17:17-21). (Here the judgment of Babylon is announced.)
- 8. The judgment of Babylon (17:1-19:10).
  - a. Babylon's destruction described (17:1-18).
  - b. Babylon's destruction explained (18:1-8).
  - c. Babylon's destruction mourned (18:9-19).
  - d. Babylon's destruction celebrated (18:20-19:10).
- C. THE EVENTS WHICH FOLLOW THE GREAT TRIBULATION (Rev. 19:11-22:5).
  - 1. The Second Coming of Jesus Christ to the earth (19:11-21).
  - 2. The Millennium (20:1-6). In verses 2 through 7, the thousand year period is mentioned no less than six times.
  - 3. The Release and Judgment of Satan (20:7-10).
  - 4. The Great White Throne Judgment (20:11-15).
  - 5. The New Heaven and the New Earth with the New Jerusalem (21:1-22:5).

### V. CONCLUSION (Revelation 22:6-21).

- A. The divine affirmation of the book (22:6-13).
- B. The final invitation (22:14-17).
- C. A solemn warning (22:18-19).
- D. The Apostle John's closing supplication and prayer (22:20-21).
