

Numbers 11 and 12

11:1-15 The People's Complaints

11:16-30 The 70 Elders Receive the Spirit

11:31-35 The LORD sends Quail

12:1-16 Aaron and Miriam speak against Moses

THE LORD SENDS QUAIL-----Numbers 11

"And the LORD said to Moses, 'Has the LORD's arm been shortened? Now you shall see whether what I say will happen to you or not." (v. 23)

After the Holy Spirit rested upon the 70 elders, "Moses returned to the camp, he and the elders of Israel." (v. 30)

"The next events were a sequence of miracle upon miracle, explained in no other way."

"(1) A miraculous wind (11:31)

(2) Quails from the sea area, probably from the Arabian Gulf to the southeast (11:31)

(3) The quails dropped at the camp (11:31)

(4) The miraculous number of quails (11:31, 32), blown off normal course in their migration, so that the birds flew waist high (three feet) above the surface of the earth. The flight lasted so long that the Israelites stood for two days and a night knocking down the quails. To keep them from spoiling the quails were spread about the camp to dry in the sun (11:32b).

(5) The climactic miracle of judgment, in which God smote a number of the people with a very great plague (11:33)."

Numbers----Application

I Corinthians 10:1-12

---Original generation of Israelite in the Exodus were believers (:1-4) ---God was not well-pleased with *most* of them (:5)

---These people are examples (types) for NT believers, and are given as instruction (admonition) for us (:6-12)
