--The Personnel

Annas Greedy, serpent-like, vindictive

Caiaphas Rude, sly, hypocritical

Pilate Crafty, superstitious, self-seeking

Herod Immoral, ambitious, superficial

--The Proceedings

- 1. The arrest of Jesus was effected as a result of a bribe.
- 2. No *trial* for life was allowed during the night. No trial *conviction* was allowed at night. Executing a *sentence* on a feast day was against Jewish regulations.
- 3. Jesus was asked to incriminate Himself.
- 4. Jewish lad forbade a sentence of death to be pronounced until the day *after* the accused had been convicted.
