I Corinthians 16:1-4 Background (Continued)

This gift was:

- (1) An acknowledgment by the Gentile churches of the spiritual debt they owed the mother-church in Jerusalem
- (2) A practical token to the Jerusalem church of the genuineness of the Gentile Christians' faith
- (3) A means of binding Jewish and Gentile

 Christians more closely together

I Corinthians 16:1-4 The Collection for the Saints in Jerusalem

"Principles of Christian Beneficence and Church Finance"

- (1) Offerings should be made by every member of the congregation (:2) "let each one of you"
- (2) These offerings should be systematic (:2) "on the first day of the week"
- (3) Offerings should be given in proportion to prosperity (:2) "as he may prosper"
- (4) Dependence is not to be placed upon occasional emotional appeals (:2) "that no collections be made when I come"
- (5) Appeals should be made to the highest motives (15:58) "always abounding in the work of the Lord"
- (6) Benevolent funds must be carefully administered (:3) "whomever you approve . . . "
- (7) Benevolent offerings should be so generous as to be worthy of Christ and His servants.
