Day	Verses	Activities
Sunday	19:28-44	Triumphal entry
Monday	19:45-48	Jesus cleanses the temple, begin teaching in the temple daily
Tues/Wednesday	20:1-22:6	Q&A with Jewish leaders/Warnings
Thursday (to early Friday AM)	22:7-71	Day of Unleavened Bread, Lords supper instituted, prays on the Mount of Olives, betrayal and trials begin
Friday	Ch. 23	End of trials, crucifixion and burial
Saturday	Matt. 27:62-66	Jesus' Tomb "Secured"
Sunday	24:1-49	The Resurrection
"Forty Days Later"	24:50-53	The Ascension

The Parable of the Ten Minas

- Luke 19:11-27
 - Training His Disciples: The Future of His Disciples
 - Purpose: Identifying the times (v11)
 - The Nobleman leaves (v12)
 - The Slaves and the Gospel (v13)
 - The Citizens hate and reject Him (v14)

The Parable of the Ten Minas

- Luke 19:11-27
 - How do we enter the kingdom of God?
 - Through the Judge and His judgment
 - The Master returns and all are judged (v15)
 - The Gospel enriches those who share it
 - (v16-19 & 24-26)
 - The Gospel condemns those who reject it
 - (20-26)
 - The punishment is severe (v27)

The Triumphal Entry

- Luke 19:28-44 (Cf. Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, John 12:12-19)
 - Passion Week begins Going up to Jerusalem (v28)
 - Prophecy Fulfilled in Zechariah 9:9 (v29-38)
 - The Crowds Revere and Rejoice for the miracles (v35-38)
 - Lazarus raised from the dead (John 12:17-18)
 - The Pharisees Resentment (v39-40)
 - Jesus Weeps for Jerusalem (v41-42)

The Triumphal Entry

- Luke 19:43-44
 - The Prophecy of Jerusalem's Destruction
 - A.D. 70 vs. End times?
 - "Peace" Peace with God
 - "For the days will come" Six fold destruction
 - The reason They rejected Jesus as Messiah

Jesus Cleanses the Temple

- Luke 19:45-48 (Cf. Matthew 21:12-17, Mark 11:15-19)
 - Travelers may purchase sacrifices (Deut. 14:24-26)
 - Priests determine clean/unclean (Lev. 27:11-12)
 - The Lord of the Temple (v45-46)
 - "And My house shall be a house of prayer" (Is. 56:7)
 - "Robbers den" (Jer. 7:11)
 - Jesus teaches daily in the temple (Luke 19:47-21:38)

Jesus' Authority Questioned

- > Luke 20:1-8
 - Chapter 20 Jesus' authority put on display through a series of attacks/questions
 - Show us your credentials! (v1-2)
 - Exposing their motives (v3-4)
 - Willful deniers and liars (v5-8)

Parable of the Vineyard Owner

- Luke 20:9-19 (Cf. Matthew 21:33-45, Mark 12:1-12)
 - Jesus warns the people (v9)
 - The vine-growers oppose the owner (v10-12)
 - The vine-growers kill the beloved son (v13-15)
 - The owner destroys the vine-growers (v16)

Parable of the Vineyard Owner

- Luke 20:17-19
 - The vine-growers reject the stone (v17)
 - The chief corner stone is the Judge (v18)
 - The parable speaks of the Jewish leaders (v19)
 - The Lord's death delayed (v19)

Conclusion

- Luke 19:11-20:19
 - Jesus' authority put on display
 - Beware of the Pharisees/false teachers
 - Heresy often begins at the top
 - Be like the Bereans (Acts 17:11)
 - The King is delayed; Praise the Lord!
