

The Creation

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3 types of parallelism

1. Synonymous parallelism: the thought of the second line <u>reinforces</u> the thought of the first line by presenting a similar thought.

Hear, my son, your father's instruction

And do not forsake your mother's teaching

Proverbs 1:8

3 types of parallelism

2. Antithetical parallelism: the thought of the second line <u>contrasts</u> the thought of the first line by presenting its opposite corollary.

For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, But the way of the wicked will perish.

Psalm 1:6

3 types of parallelism

3. Synthetic parallelism: the thought of the second line develops, complements, supplements, supports, illustrates, or otherwise advances the thought of the first line by presenting a thought which is somehow related.






