



 - 3) Universal Blessing (12:3) —> Salvation (Gal. 3:8)
 - B. The promise passed to Isaac, not Ishmael (17:19, 26:3-4)
 - C. The promise passed to Jacob, not Esau (25:23, 28:13-15)
