#### The Farewell Discourse

- **→** In the Upper Room (13:1-14:31)
  - Jesus gives the disciples an example of loving humility (13:1-20)
  - Jesus identifies Judas as the betrayer (13:21-30)
  - Jesus predicts His imminent death (13:31-33)
  - Love one another with a perfect love (13:34-35)
  - Peter will deny Jesus 3 times (13:36-38)
  - The secret to comfort is to believe, love and obey
    Christ (14)

- **♦** In the Upper Room (13:1-14:31)
- →On the way to the Garden (15:1-17:26)
  - Our relationship to Christ is to abide in Him (15:1-11)
  - Our relationship to those in the church is to love one another (15:12-17)
  - Our relationship to the World is to expect persecution (15:18-16:1-4)

- III. Our relationship to the World is to expect persecution (15:18-16:1-4)
  - A. The world hates and persecutes the truth (15:18-25)
  - B. The church responds to persecution by proclaiming the truth in the power of the Holy Spirit (15:26-27)
  - C. Jesus promises remembrance in His Word (16:1-4)
