The flesh a false hope of salvation Philippians 3:1-4

¹Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things *again* is no trouble to me, and it is a safeguard for you.

²Beware of the dogs, beware of the evil workers, beware of the false circumcision; ³for we are the *true* circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh, ⁴although I myself might have confidence even in the flesh. If anyone else has a mind to put confidence in the flesh, I far more:

- True circumcision
 - Worships in the Spirit of God
 - Glories in Christ Jesus
 - Puts no confidence in the flesh
- True circumcision is not of the flesh

Righteousness from God true hope of salvation Philippians 3:5-8

⁵circumcised the eighth day, of the nation of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the Law, a Pharisee; ⁶as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to the righteousness which is in the Law, found blameless.

⁷But whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸More than that, I count all things to be loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them but rubbish so that I may gain Christ,

Pauls' boast in the flesh

- Being
 - Circumcised on the 8th day
 - From Israel
 - From Benjamin
 - A Hebrew of Hebrews
- "As to"
 - Law Pharisee
 - Zeal a persecutor of the church
 - Righteousness blameless
- The gain of fleshly righteousness is now loss

Paul's response to salvation Philippians 3:9-12

⁹and may be found in Him, not having a **righteousness** of my own derived **from** *the* Law, but that which is through **faith** in Christ, the **righteousness** which comes **from** God on the basis of **faith**, ¹⁰that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death; ¹¹in order that I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.

¹²Not that I have already obtained *it* or have already become perfect, but I press on so that I may lay hold of that for which also I was laid hold of by Christ Jesus.

- The two types of righteousness
 - From the Law
 - From God, through Christ on the basis of faith
- Christ lays hold of us
- We seek to lay hold of that for which Christ laid hold of us

Our response to salvation Philippians 3:13-16

¹³Brethren, I do not regard myself as having **laid hold of** *it* yet; but one thing *I do*: forgetting what *lies* behind and reaching forward to what *lies* ahead, ¹⁴I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. ¹⁵Let us therefore, as many as are perfect, have this attitude; and if in anything you have a different attitude, God will reveal that also to you; ¹⁶however, let us keep living by that same *standard* to which we have attained.

- Having not yet laid hold of
 - Forget what lies behind
 - Reach forward to what lies ahead
- Athletic imagery for the Christian life

Our response to salvation Philippians 3:17-21

¹⁷Brethren, join in following my example, and observe those who walk according to the pattern you have in us. ¹⁸For many walk, of whom I often told you, and now tell you even weeping, that they are enemies of the cross of Christ, ¹⁹whose end is destruction, whose god is their appetite, and whose glory is in their shame, who set their minds on earthly things. ²⁰For our citizenship is in heaven, from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ; ²¹who will transform the body of our humble state into conformity with the **body of** His glory, by the exertion of the power that He has even to subject all things to Himself.

- We are to follow good Christian examples
- Our citizenship is in heaven
- We expect our Savior to come back from heaven

Summary

- Beware of those who put confidence in the flesh
- We need to count all things loss compared with knowing Christ
- We need the righteousness from God through faith in Christ
- We need to press on to lay hold of that for which Christ laid hold of us
- We are citizens of heaven
- When our Savior returns our humble bodies will be transformed into glorious bodies
