

Ephesians and Colossians Compared

- ▶ Paul claims apostleship
- ► Each deals with a fundamental doctrine of the Christian faith
- ▶ The core messages are different
 - Ephesians the mystery and the administration of the mystery
 - Colossians the pressure to turn away from the mystery
- ► The common structure of both epistles
 - A message to saints and faithful brethren in Christ Jesus
 - A review of the work of salvation
 - A presentation of the main issue
 - A demonstration of the outcome of the work of salvation in the believer

- ► Paul an apostle of Jesus Christ
- ▶ To the saints and faithful brethren
- Grace and peace

The Colossian Believers (1:3-8)

- ► Thanksgiving to God
- ► Faith in Christ Jesus
- Love for the saints
- Hope laid up for them in heaven
- ► The word of truth of the Gospel
- Fruitfulness
- Epaphras commended

Paul's Prayer for the Saints (1:9-14)

- An appeal to God
- ► To be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and understanding
- ► A walk worthy of the Lord
 - Fruitful
 - Increasing in the knowledge of God
 - Strengthened by His power
 - Steadfast with joyful patience
- ► Thanksgiving to God the Father

A Lesson on Christology (1:15-23)

- ► Christ's Person (1:15-20)
 - Image of the invisible God
 - Firstborn of all creation
 - Creator of all things
 - Possessor of heaven and earth
 - Before all things preeminent
 - Firstborn from the dead
 - All the fullness of God in Him
 - Savior through the Cross

A Lesson on Christology (1:15-23)

- ► Christ's Work (1:21-23)
 - His subjects alienated, hostile, evil
 - Christ reconciled all things to God
 - Christ presents us holy and blameless and without reproach before the Father
 - His subjects continue in the faith

Paul the Apostle (1:24-29)

- ► Paul, an apostle or steward of the mystery
- ► The sufferings of Christ in Paul
- ► Paul's ministry teaching "Christ in you, the hope of glory"
- ► Paul's method proclaiming, admonishing, laboring, striving

The Preeminence of Christ

- ► The key to the Christian message is Christ
- ► The need to be grounded and growing in the truth
- ► Complete in Christ
