Exodus 11-12

Lessons from the Plagues

- ♦ The first three plagues: Blood, Frogs, and Lice
 - ♦ "Purpose: That you may know that I am the LORD
 - ♦ Result: "Plead with the LORD for me"
- ♦ The second three plagues: Flies, Death of livestock, and Boils
 - ♦ Purpose: The LORD puts a difference between the Egyptians and His people
 - ♦ Result: "Pharaoh sent and behold, not one... was dead"
- The third three plagues: Hail, Locusts, and Darkness
 - ♦ Purpose: "That you may know that there is none like the LORD"
 - ♦ Result: "I have sinned against the LORD and against you"

The Final Plague Threatened

- ♦ The LORD announces the plague to Moses (11:1-2, 4-8)
 - ♦ "The LORD said" or "The LORD had said"
 - ♦ "Command the people to borrow from their neighbors..."
 - ♦ God's promises fulfilled (3:21-22)
 - ♦ God's ownership of all things demonstrated (Matt: 25:27-28)
 - ♦ "At midnight I will strike every firstborn in the Land of Egypt"
 - ♦ Universal plague for the Egyptians
 - ♦ Israel delivered: "I will put a difference between Egypt and Israel"
 - ♦ After this... You will be cast out of the land

The Final Plague Threatened

- Moses Before Pharaoh (10:24-29, 11: 8-10)
 - Aftermath of the plague of darkness
 - ♦ Pharaoh bargains (vs. 24)
 - ♦ Moses refuses (vs. 25-26)
 - ♦ Pharaoh's heart hardened and the people commanded to stay
 - Pharaoh threatens death to Moses if he returns (vs. 28)
 - ♦ The LORD threatens death if his people not freed (11:4-8)
 - Moses leaves pharaoh in hot anger
- Pharaoh's heart hardened
 - ♦ "That my wonders may be multiplied in the land of Egypt"

- ♦ The Substance of the Sacrifice (vs. 1-11)
 - ♦ The Offering
 - ♦ 1 Year old lamb
 - ♦ To be without spot or blemish
 - ♦ To be watched for 4 days before sacrifice
 - ♦ The Timing: At twilight on the 14th day of the 1st month
 - ♦ Sacrificial commands
 - ♦ Paint doorposts and Lintel with the Lamb's blood
 - ♦ The lamb to be roasted with bitter herbs and eaten in haste
 - ♦ Eat while girded and ready to depart

- ♦ The Statute of the Sacrifice (vs.14-20, 43-49)
 - ♦ To be remembered forever for all generation
 - ♦ To be accompanied by the Feast of unleavened bread
 - ♦ Only to eat unleavened bread for 7 days
 - ♦ No leaven allowed even in the house
 - ♦ No work to be done
 - ♦ A Holy feast on the first and last day of the feast
 - ♦ Only members of Abraham's covenant free to participate
 - Foreigners included through circumcision
 - ♦ Likely due to the 'mixed multitude' who left Egypt

- The Significance of the Sacrifice (vs.12-13)
 - ♦ When I see the blood I will "Pass Over" you and you will not be destroyed
 - ♦ To skip over in judgment or to hover over to protect
 - * A remembrance of how God delivered and preserved Israel
- ♦ The Submission to the Sacrifice (vs. 27-28)
 - ♦ The people bow their heads and worship
 - ♦ The people did as the LORD commanded them
 - ♦ Egyptians vs. Israel hearing the word of God
 - ♦ Heard -> Believed -> Trusted and Obeyed
 - ♦ Heard -> Believed -> Rejected

Israel Delivered

- ♦ Judgment arrives (vs. 29-30)
 - ♦ Both men and beast struck in every household of Egypt
- ♦ Israel cast out in Haste (vs. 31-40)
 - ♦ Pharaoh surrenders and frees the whole Nation (vs. 31-32)
 - ♦ Israel eats unleavened bread in the wilderness
 - ♦ Note: Moses didn't relate this feast in previous section
 - ♦ God's promises to Abraham kept
 - ♦ Gen. 15:13 vs. Ex. 12:40-41

Final Notes

- ♦ None of God's purposes frustrated (Is. 55:11)
 - ♦ His glorious name revealed and spread throughout the Earth
 - ♦ His people delivered in His own sovereign timing
- Who is Yahweh?
 - ♦ The one who redeems His people
 - ♦ The one who is faithful to keep His promises
 - ♦ The one who answers prayer
 - ♦ The almighty God of Heaven and Earth
