 - ♦ You shall have no gods in my presence
 - ♦ You shall not make any idols
 - Postscript of the Ten Commandments

The Idolatry of the People (Vs. 1-6)

♦ The actions of the people

- ♦ Make us gods to go before us... We don't know what has become of Moses
- ♦ The people bring their jewelry to Aaron
- ♦ These are your gods who brought you out of the land of Egypt!
- \diamond Offer burnt offerings, ate and drank, and rose up to play

The reactions of Aaron

- ♦ Bring me your jewelry for building materials
- ♦ Aaron fashions the gold into a molten calf
- ♦ Builds an altar before the calf and declares a festival to the LORD
- ♦ Aaron allows them to pursue wickedness to their shame

The Idolatry of the People (Vs. 1-6)

- ♦ What was Israel's sin?
 - ♦ They rejected God's servant Moses
 - ♦ Ex. 32:1b, Acts 7: 38-42
 - ♦ They rejected the presence of the LORD
 ♦ Ex. 32: 1b
 - They forsook and forgot the LORD
 Acts. 7:39, Ps. 106:19-22
- ♦ What was the result of Israel's sin
 - ♦ Idol worship
 - ♦ God gave them over (Rom. 1:21-23, Acts. 7:41-42)
 - ♦ Participation in a pagan worship festival

The Intercession of Moses (Vs. 7-14)

♦ The LORD announces the just consequences for Israel's sin

- ♦ Separation with God: "...your people have corrupted themselves"
- ♦ Destruction and death: "...That I may consume them in my wrath"

♦ The appeals of Moses

- ♦ Remember the honor and glory of your name (Vs. 12)
- ♦ Remember your covenant promises (Vs. 13)
 - ♦ Eternal covenant made with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob
- ♦ The LORD relents from destroying Israel
 - ♦ A display of God's incredible mercy and faithfulness
 - ♦ A display of the importance of intercession

Moses and the People (Vs. 15-29)

♦ Moses' immediate response to Israel's idolatry

- ♦ Breaks the tablets of the ten commandments
- ♦ Makes Israel drink of the destroyed calf

♦ Moses responds to Aaron

- ♦ Aaron's responsibility for Israel's sin
- ♦ Aaron's excuse
- ♦ Punishment for the people
 - ♦ Levites answer call to judge
 - ♦ Sent throughout the camp to kill the guilty
 - ♦ No relationship to stand in the way of judgment

The 2nd Intercession of Moses (Vs. 30-35)

♦ The need for further Intercession

- ♦ Some punished but whole nation complicit
- ♦ Their sins need atonement
- ♦ Moses's plea to God
 - \Leftrightarrow ...Forgive the sin of the people
 - ♦ If not... punish me instead
- ♦ God's response
 - ♦ Whoever sins, I will blot out of my book (Ez. 18:4)
 - ♦ Lead the people and my Angel will go before you

 - ♦ Israel Vs. the Church
- ♦ The Intercessor for the LORD's people
 - ♦ Moses vs. Christ
- ♦ The Law vs. the Gospel
 - \diamond Horeb vs. the Church
- ♦ God Vs. Man
 - ♦ Man's forgetfulness vs. God's faithfulness
- Warning Against Idolatry
 - ☆ "The human mind is, so to speak, a perpetual forge of idols." John Calvin
 - ♦ Worship God as he has revealed himself
