The Popularity of Jesus' Ministry

♦ Parallel records: Matt. 8: 13-17, Luke 4: 38-41

Jesus leaves the synagogue and *immediately* enters Peter's house (1:29)
 Immediately they tell Him of Peter's mother-in-law
 Sick in bed with a high fever (Lk. 4:38)

♦ Jesus ministers to her

♦ Stood next to her and rebukes the fever (Luke 4: 39)

♦ Take her by the hand and lifts her up (1:31)

- $\diamond\,$ The fever leaves her and she is healed
- ♦ She begins to minister Jesus and his disciples

The Popularity of Jesus' Ministry

- ♦ That same evening at sundown (1:32)
- ♦ Entire city gathers to be healed (1:33)

♦ People with various diseases (Matt. 4:23-25)

- ♦ People oppressed by demons

♦ Jesus heals...

- ♦ … Every one of them. (Matt. 8:17)

The Purpose of Jesus' Ministry

♦ Jesus' morning retreat

- ♦ In the early early morning
- ♦ In a desolate or deserted place
- ♦ Praying to His Father in Heaven
- ♦ The people come to find Jesus
 - ♦ The disciples
 - ♦ The crowds
- ♦ Jesus reveals his purpose
 - ♦ I must go to preach in other towns
 - ♦ This was why I went out (Why I was sent Lk. 4:43)
 - ♦ To preach the gospel to all (1:14-15)

The Pity in Jesus' Ministry

- ♦ The leper's condition
 - ♦ Unclean, alone, exiled outside the camp (Lev. 13:45)
 - ♦ Like one who is half dead from the moment of his birth (Num. 12:12)
 - Symbolizes the corruption of sin
- ♦ The leper's approach
 - ♦ Intreating or begging to be healed
 - ♦ Fell down on his face before him
- ♦ The leper's confession
 - ♦ Lord, if you are willing, you are able to make me clean (Matt. 8:2)

The Pity in Jesus' Ministry

♦ Jesus' response

- $\diamond\,$ He was moved with compassion
- ♦ I am willing, be clean
- ♦ Immediately the leprosy is healed
- ♦ Jesus' command to the leper
 - ♦ Tell no man... except for the priest
 - \diamond Go and show yourself to the priest to be declared clean (Lev. 14)

♦ The leper's response

- ♦ Did he show himself to the priests?
- ♦ Spoke to all about it

The Power in Jesus' Ministry

- ♦ The people approach (2:1-2)
 - ♦ Jesus enters Capernaum and the people hear he is there (Vs. 1)
 - ♦ Immediately a crowd comes to see him (Vs. 2)
 - $\diamond\,$ Jesus preached the word to them
- ♦ The faith of the five (3-4)
 - ♦ Borne by four friends but prevented by the crowds
 - $\diamond\,$ Uncovered the roof and lowered him down
 - ♦ When Jesus saw their faith...
- ♦ The palsied man forgiven
 - \diamond ...Son, your sins are forgiven

The Power in Jesus' Ministry

The lack of faith of the scribes (Vs. 6-7)
Who can forgive sins except for God?

♦ Jesus proves his divine authority (8-11)

♦ Which is harder? Physical healing vs. Spiritual healing

- ♦ That you would know that the Son of Man has authority
- ♦ Palsied man told to rise and walk
- Palsied man immediately walks and goes home
- ♦ The people respond (Vs. 12)
 - ♦ They praise God
 - ♦ We have never seen anything like this
