Introduction

- ♦ Theme: The gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God Mark 1:1
- ♦ Who is Jesus?
 - ♦ Jesus is the Christ. The Messiah (Mark 1:14 8:30)
 - ♦ Jesus is the Son of God (Mark 8:31 15:40)
- ♦ What is the gospel? (Mark 15:41 16:20)
 - ♦ Jesus came, lived, died and rose again.
 - Salvation to all who believe on Him.
- Overview (Mark 10:46-11:26)
 - ♦ A blind man healed (10:46 52)
 - ♦ The triumphal entry (11:1-10)
 - ♦ The fig tree and the Temple (11:11-26)

Jesus and the Blind Man

- ♦ The healing of Blind Bartimaeus The last miracle story before the crucifixion
 - ♦ Recorded in all three synoptic gospels: Mark 10:46-52, Matt. 20:29-34, Luke 18:35-43

- Location for the miracle: The region of Jericho as Jesus leaves the city
- ♦ The identity of the man: Bartimaeus the son of Timaeus
- ♦ The occupation of the man: A beggar
- The condition of the man
 - ♦ A man who had lost his sight (Vs. 46, 51)
 - Onsidered an outcast under God's curse

Jesus and the Blind Man

- ♦ The persistent plea: "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"
 - Who is he identifying Jesus of Nazareth as?
 - What is he asking for?
 - ♦ Is this normal behavior for a beggar?

- ♦ Jesus' compassion: Bring him to me
- ♦ Jesus' question: What do you want me to do for you?
 - ♦ Response: "Lord, let me recover my sight"

'Your faith has 'made you well' or your faith has saved you

The Triumphal Entry

- ♦ The entry prophesied Zechariah 9:9-11
 - ♦ Thy King comes riding on a colt
 - ♦ He is bringing salvation
 - ♦ He is coming to establish His dominion
- ♦ Jesus and the coming Kingdom (Lk. 19: 11-27)
- ♦ The colt is brought to Jesus (Vs. 1-6)
- ♦ Jesus approaches the city seated on the colt (Vs. 7-10)
 - The people spread cloaks and branches before him (Vs. 8)
 - ♦ The people sing 'Hosanna' Save us now (Ps. 118:25)
 - ♦ The people praise the King and the Kingdom (Vs. 9-10)

The Temple and the Fig Tree

- ♦ Jesus comes to investigate (Vs. 11-13)
 - God comes down to observes the iniquity of men
 - Imminent judgment upon sin is coming

- ♦ The fig tree: A false claim of fruit
 - What is implied by a fig tree in leaf?
 - ♦ Were the tree's actions justified?

- ♦ The fig tree judged (Vs. 14, 20)
 - ♦ What is the tree judged for?

The Temple and the Fig Tree

- ♦ The fig tree and Israel
 - Fruitlessness leads to judgment
 - ♦ What was Jesus looking for from Israel? (Is. 5:7)
- ♦ The Temple cleansed (Vs. 15-19)
 - ♦ False piety exposed as theft
 - ♦ Jesus purpose: The purity and holiness of God's name
 - ♦ The future foreshadowed: The King in his temple (Matt. 21:14)
- ♦ The Pharisees response: "Stop it!"
 - Persistent fruitlessness indicates that judgment is coming

Faith and Prayer

♦ The Disciple's question: How did this happen to the fig tree? (Vs. 21, Matt. 21: 20)

- What does Jesus' response teach us about prayer
 - ♦ Whatever you ask in prayer -> Come to the Lord in prayer
 - ♦ Have faith in God -> Look to God for the answer
 - ♦ Believe that you have received it -> trust in the Lord
 - ♦ Forgive others -> Forgive as we were forgiven

- For what should we pray?
 - ♦ The will of our Lord Jesus Christ (1 Tim. 2: 1-7)
