 - ♦ Context: A time of great judgment upon the Davidic line
- The purpose of Psalm 89
 - To praise the eternally faithful and loving God
 - ⋄ To pray for deliverance from judgment
 - To teach us to trust in Yahweh

I Will Sing of the Lord's Faithfulness Forever

- ♦ What is the Psalmist's thesis?
 - ♦ The Lord is eternally loving (Vs. 1a)
 - ♦ The Lord is faithful (Vs. 1b)
 - ♦ The Lord has promised to establish David's throne and his seed forever (Vs. 4)
- ♦ Emphasis placed on two aspects of God's character
 - ♦ God's Covenantal love
 - ♦ God's eternal faithfulness

Praise to the God of Heaven and Earth

- ♦ God's greatness is shown in the heavens (vs. 5)
 - The heavens themselves declare his glory
 - The hosts of angels praise his faithfulness
- ♦ God's greatness is incomparable (vs. 6-7)
 - ♦ There are none in heaven or Earth to compare to God
 - His might and glory are to be had in reverence
- ♦ God's might is shown on the Earth (8-13)
 - He rules over the raging seas
 - He overcomes all his adversaries
 - He is creator and owner of all things

Praise to the God of Heaven and Earth

- God's goodness is praised by His people (14-18)
 - ♦ God praised as our gracious ruler and king
 - God praised for the blessings He bestows upon His people
 - ♦ God praised as the one who upholds His people

Covenant Promises and Judgments

- The Covenant Promises (vs. 19-37)
 - I have chosen and anointed David as king
 - My arm will be with him and strengthen him
 - I will preserve and give victory over the enemy
 - ♦ I will show him covenantal love and faithfulness
 - ♦ I will establish his offspring and throne as long as the sun and moon endure
- The Judgments of the Lord
 - You have rejected and cast off your anointed
 - Your arm is against him and strengthens the enemy
 - You have caused the enemy to triumph
 - You have cut off his throne in its youth

A Prayer to the Faithful King

- ♦ The Psalmist's 1st request
 - Forgive us and turn away your wrath
 - ♦ If you do not intervene... we will be cast down to death
- ♦ The Psalmist's 2nd request
 - Show us your covenant love and faithfulness
 - Vindicate yourself and your people before the nations
- The Psalmist's Doxology
 - ♦ Blessed be the Lord forever
