the sovereignty of God

- God's absolute authority and control over all over all His creation
- God accomplishes all things according His will
- nothing ever happens apart from the will of God


the responsibility of man

- \cdot man's is fully responsibility for all his actions \cdot obedient and disobedient
- man is always responsible to obey his Creator
- man is free to act according to his nature



a biblical "mystery"

- · a truth that is hidden by God
- a truth that human wisdom cannot discover or understand
- a truth that requires further revelation from God to be known
 EXAMPLE: "the church" · Ephesians 3:1-13

Romans 8:18-39 • the promise of glorification

Romans 8:35 • *"Who can separate us from the love of Christ?"*

Romans 8:35 • *"For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."*

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What happened to Israel ???

Jeremiah 31:3 • the LORD to Israel: *"I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore I have drawn you with lovingkindness."*

Did God's love for Israel fail ??? Will God's love for the church fail ???



(6) It is not as though the word of God has failed.



God's will · God's choice · God's word

Romans 9 · sovereignty and responsibility the 1st key statement

1 Romans 9: 6-13

(6) It is not as though the word of God has failed.

God's word (call) is according to God's will (choice) (8) It is not the children of flesh who are children of God, but the children of the <u>promise</u> are regarded as descendants/seed.

<u>God's word (call) is not according to man's person or works</u> (11-13) this is a word of <u>promise</u> (9) ... for though *the twins* were not yet born, and had not done anything good or bad, in order that God's purpose according to *His* choice might stand, not because of works, but because of Him who <u>calls</u>, it was <u>said</u> to her, "The older will serve the younger" (Genesis 25:23). Just as it is <u>written</u>, "Jacob have I loved, but Esau I hated" (Malachi 1:21).

God's word is always true · God always keeps His word



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Romans 9 · sovereignty and responsibility <u>the 2nd key statement</u>

2 Romans 9:14-18

(14) There is no injustice with God, is there? No, never!

God's word is not according to man's will or action

(15-16) For <u>He says</u> to Moses, "I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion" (Ex. 33:19). <u>So then</u> it *does* not *depend* upon the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy.

God's word is according to God's will (desire)

(17-18) For the <u>Scripture says</u> to Pharaoh, "For this very purpose I raised you up, to demonstrate My power in you, and that My name might be proclaimed throughout the whole earth" (Ex. 9:16). <u>So then</u> He has mercy on whom He desires and He hardens whom He desires.

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Romans 9 · sovereignty and responsibility <u>the 3rd key statement</u>

3 Romans 9:19-24

(19) Why does God still find fault? For who can resist His will?

<u>God's word is authoritative · God is not answerable to man</u> (20) On the contrary, who are you, O man, who <u>answers</u> back to God? The thing molded will not <u>say</u> to the molder, "Why did you make me like this, will it?"

God's word is according to God's will (purpose)

(22-24) What if God, although willing to demonstrate His wrath and to make His power known, endured with much patience vessels of wrath prepared for destruction? And *He did so* in order that He might make known the riches of His glory upon vessels of mercy, which He prepared before hand for glory, even us, whom He also <u>called</u> ... [Gentiles].

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2 Romans 10 · prayer to God for the salvation of Israel

(10:1) Brethren, my heart's desire and my prayer to God for them is for their salvation.

(10:11) For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes in Him will not be disappointed" (Isaiah 28:16).

(10:13) ... for "Whoever will call upon the name of the Lord will be saved" (Joel 2:32).

(10:14-15) How then shall they call upon Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring glad tiding of good things" (Isaiah 52:7).

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
