## Old Testament Eschatology

### Eschatology → DEFINITION

Greek · ἔσχατος = ESCHATOS → “last”

Greek · λόγος = LOGOS → “to speak”

LOGOS = a word conceived &  
a word spoken

ESCHATOS + LOGOS → “last” + “saying”

to speak of last things

to speak of end times

to speak of things to come

## Old Testament Eschatology

### Eschatology → KEY HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENTS

creation · the fall · the promise

① “the seed” promise · a glorious victory · salvation

the covenants:

& dominion

② Noahic

③ Abrahamic · land, nation, blessing

④ Mosaic · the Law = the seed will save

⑤ Davidic · the king = the seed will rule

⑥ new · the triumphant salvation & kingdom

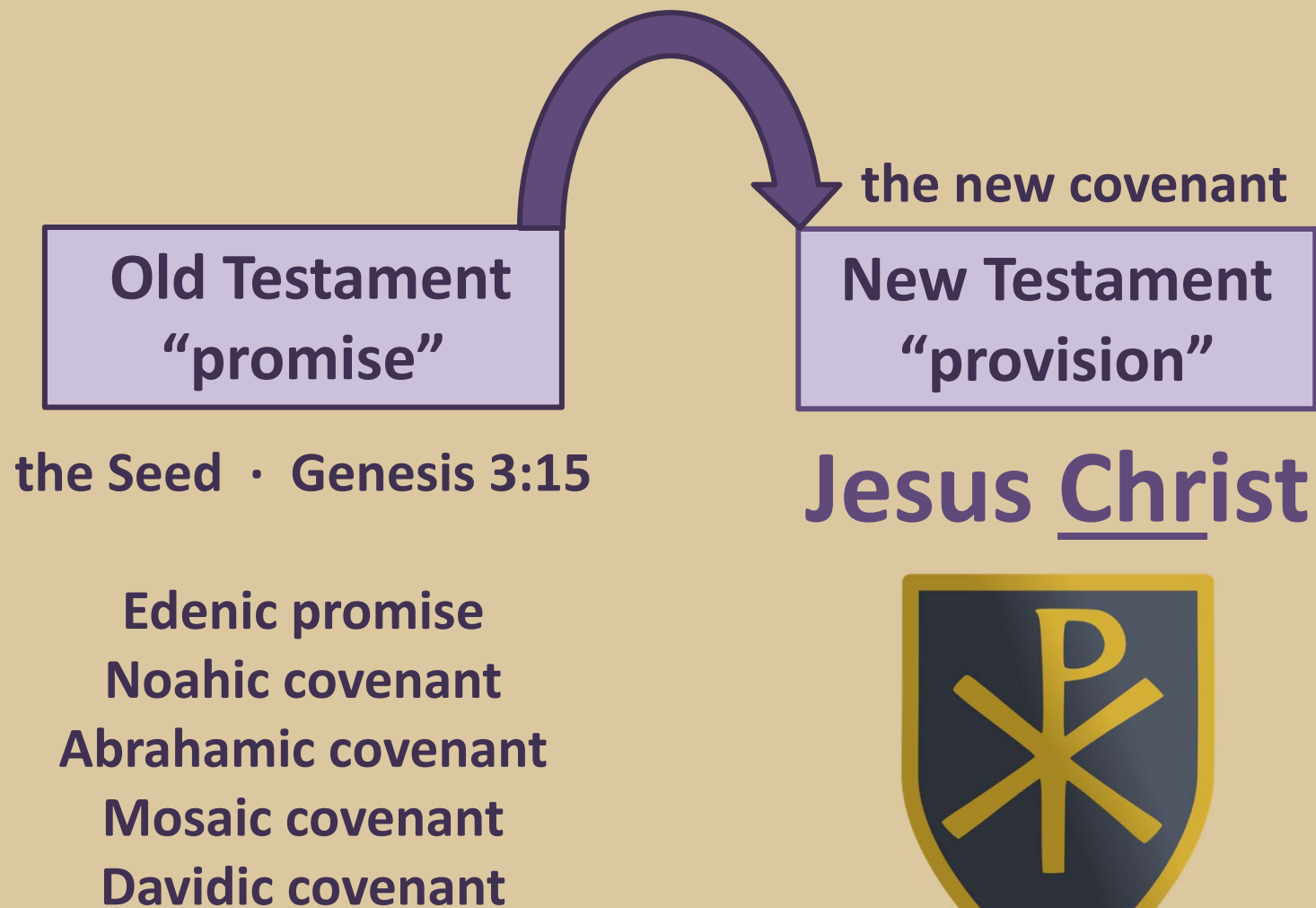
1<sup>st</sup> phase = the church

2<sup>nd</sup> phase = the millennial kingdom

3<sup>rd</sup> phase = the new heavens and the new earth

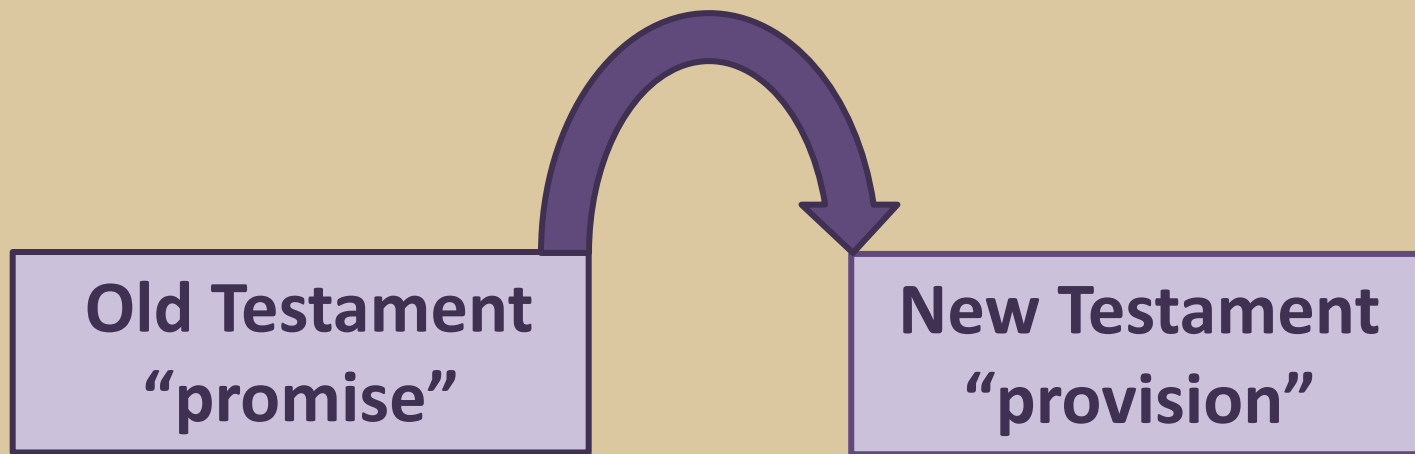

Son of Man · Son of God

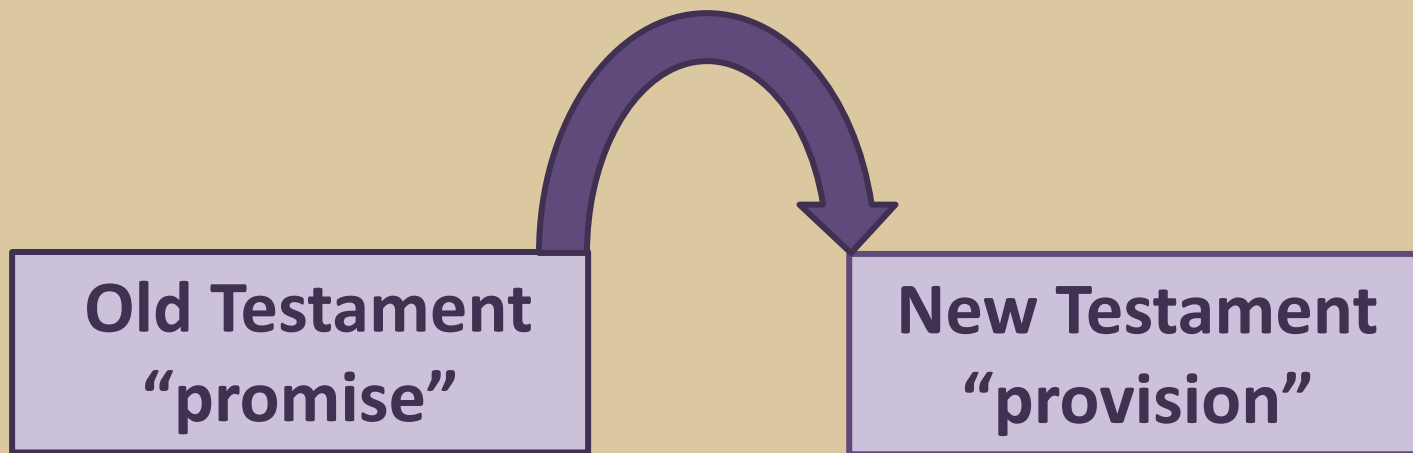
Prophet · Priest · King

# The Things to Come

## New Testament Eschatology

### Eschatology → DEFINITION

Greek · ἔσχατος = ESCHATOS → “last”

ESCHATOS + LOGOS → “last” + “saying”

to speak of last things · the end times · the things to come

### Eschatology → KEY DISTINCTIONS

the relationship of the covenants:

- ▶ “the Old Covenant” to “the New Covenant”

the relationship of “Israel” to the “church”:

- ▶ progressive theology -vs- replacement theology

# The Things to Come

## New Testament Eschatology

### Eschatology → KEY DEVELOPMENTS

- 1 the rapture** = “caught up”  
pre-trib./ beginning · mid-trib./ middle · post-trib./ ending
- 2 the resurrection**  
NT saints · OT saints · trib. martyrs · mill. saints · the lost dead
- 3 the tribulation**  
preterist/ 70 AD · historicist/ church history · futurist/ things to come
- 4 second coming**  
1<sup>st</sup> coming as the Savior · 2<sup>nd</sup> coming as the King
- 5 the kingdom**  
pre-millennial · a-millennial · post-millennial
- 6 the judgment**  
judgment seat of Christ · separation of sheep and goats ·  
great white throne judgment
- 7 the new heavens and the new earth**

**Eschatology → the parts of the whole**

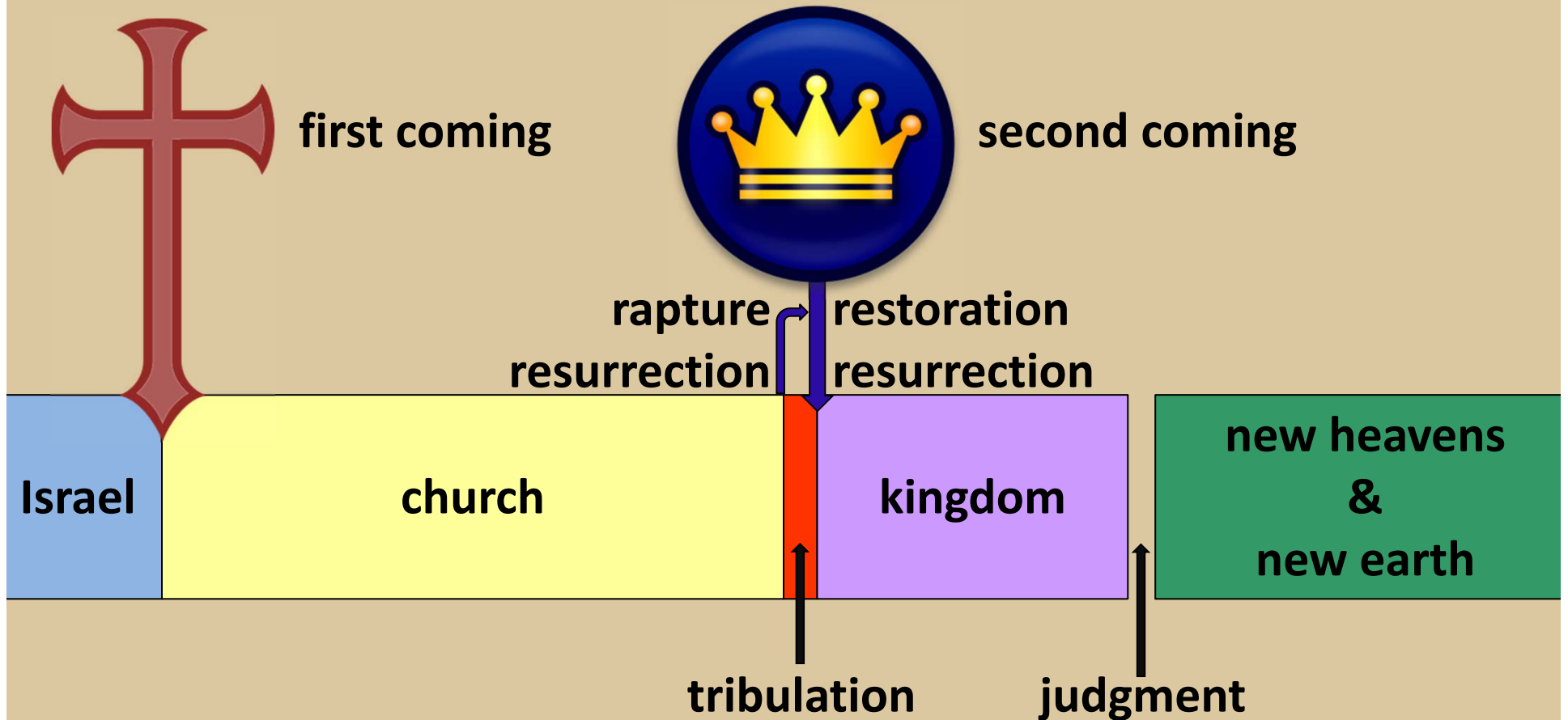

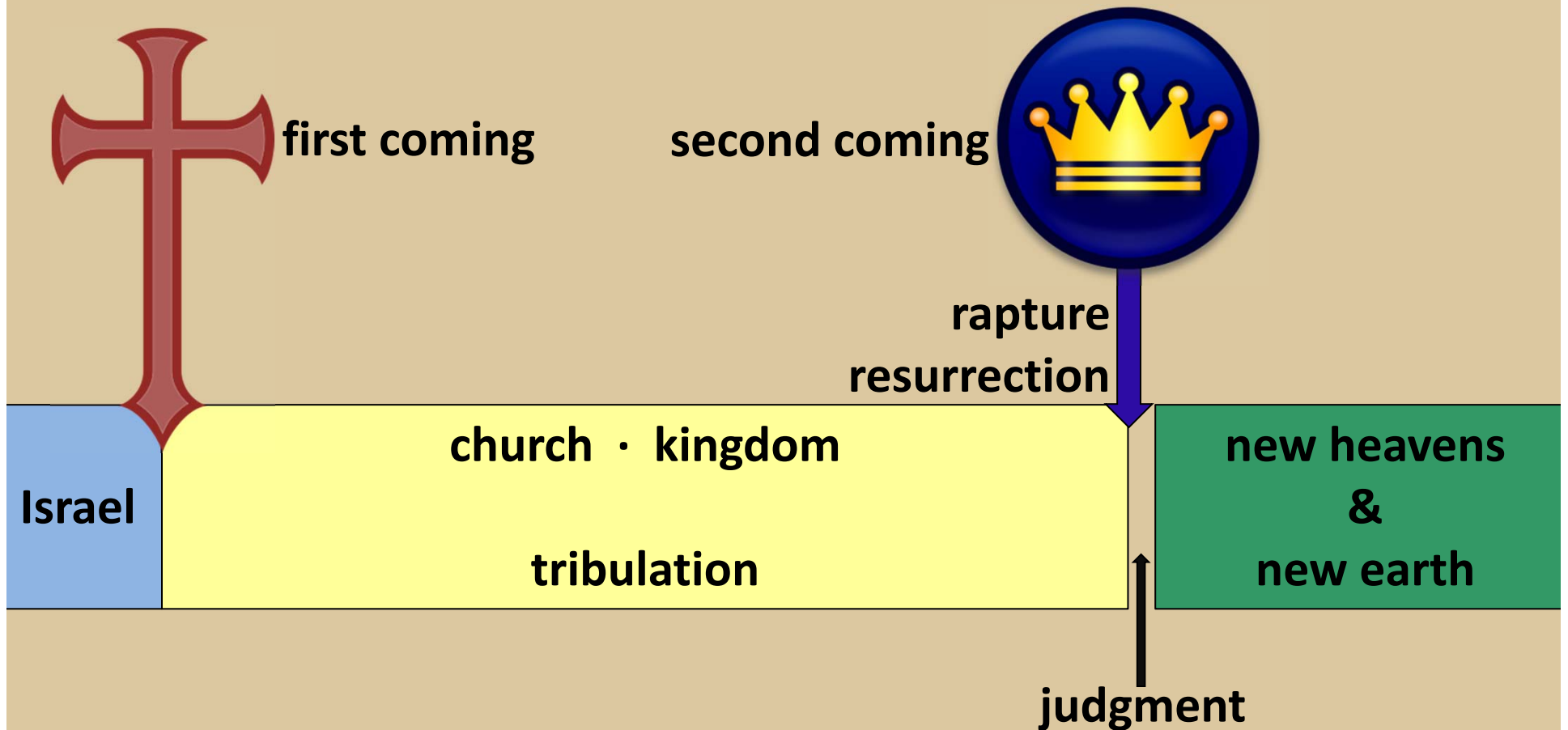

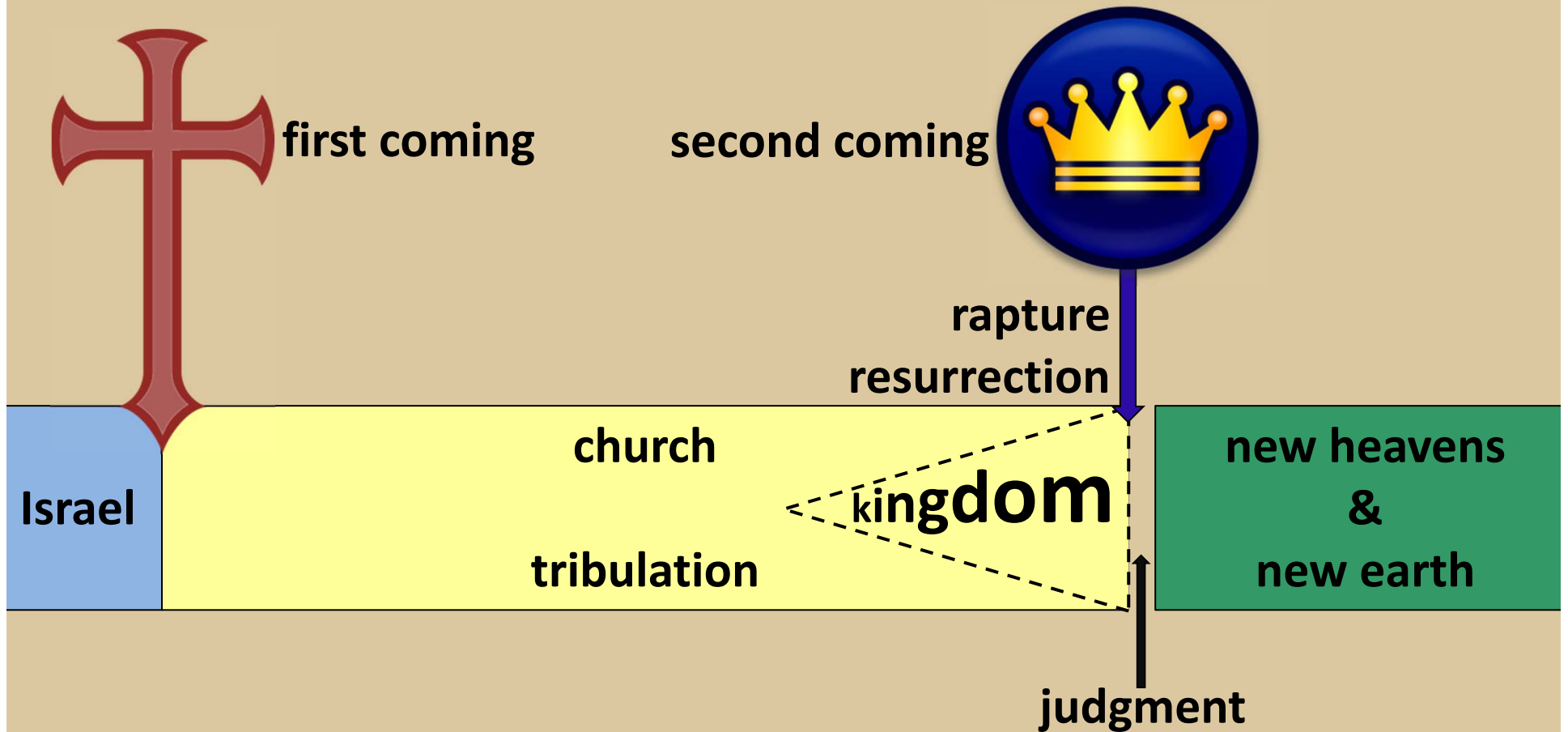

# The Things to Come

## Old Testament Eschatology

The Seed Promise

the victory

The Messianic Promise

Son of Man – Son of God

Suffering Servant – Reigning King

Savior – Ruler

The Fulfillment of the Promise

restoration – resurrection – salvation

coming, presence and dominion of the Messiah

judgment of the wicked

kingdom – outpouring of the Spirit of God

new covenant

Messiah (Hebrew) = the anointed one, the chosen one, “Christ” (Greek)

Consecrating someone / setting them apart for a divinely appointed role.

# The Things to Come

New Testament Eschatology → Revelation

## Views of the Book of Revelation:

1. Futurist – events at the end of the age
2. Preterist – events at the 70 AD destruction of Jerusalem
3. Historicist – events throughout church history
4. Idealist – symbolic of the struggles leading to the final victory
