John 12:23

The hour has come

that the Son of Man should be glorified.

2:4 “My hour has not yet come.” --to his mom at wedding

7:6 “My time has not yet come . . .”

:8 “My time has not yet fully come.” --to his brothers
prior to Feast of Tabernacles

7:30 “Therefore they sought to take Him; but no one laid a hand on Him, because his hour had not yet come.”
--following His claim to be from the Father

8:20 “. . . and no one laid hands on Him, for His hour had not yet come.”--after claiming God as His Father

12:23 **THE HOUR HAS COME**

13:1 “. . . when Jesus knew that His hour had come . . .”

17:1 “Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You.”

Fulfilled Prophecy/the Glory of Christ

John 12:37-41

v. 37

“But although He had done so many signs before them,

<i>--changed water into wine</i>	<i>ch. 2</i>
<i>--healed infirm man of 38 years</i>	<i>ch. 5</i>
<i>--created food for 5k men (plus)</i>	<i>ch. 6</i>
<i>--walked on water</i>	<i>ch. 6</i>
<i>--healed congenitally blind man</i>	<i>ch. 7</i>
<i>--raised Lazarus from the dead</i>	<i>ch. 11</i>

they **did** not believe in Him,
that the word of Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled . . .”
(53:1)

v. 39
