#### Introduction

- Topic for today: The Olivet Discourse
  - ♦ Recorded in the synoptic gospels (Matt. 24, Mark 13, Luke 21)
- ♦ Eschatology: Is it important?
  - Longest answer Jesus gives to any question
  - Prepares God's people for the present and the future
  - Encourages God's people through trouble
  - ♦ Informs us how to act as these events come to pass
- Focus and stand firm on what is clearly revealed
- A Have grace and kindness on what is more obscure

### Judgment on the Temple

- ♦ Jesus' prophecy of coming destruction (Vs. 1-2)
  - ♦ Prompted by the conversations of his disciples (Mk. 13:1, Matt. 24:1, Lk. 21:5)
  - Indicated complete destruction of the temple and surrounding area
- Why was the Temple going to be destroyed?
  - ♦ The need for the temple was about to pass away
    - Christ's sacrifice gave us complete access to the Father
    - Christ's sacrifice perfectly atoned for sin
  - The rejection of Christ brings judgment
    - ♦ 'You will be destroyed because you rejected the Messiah (Lk. 19: 41-44)
    - Sesus response to this rejection: "He wept over the city"

### Jesus and the Disciples

- ♦ The disciples private questions (Vs. 3-4, Matt. 24: 3, Lk. 21:7)
  - When is the destruction of the temple going to come to pass?
  - What should we look for to know when you are coming at the end of the age?
- The disciples' assumption: These things are coming now or very soon
  - ♦ They thought the kingdom was to appear immediately (Lk. 19:11)
  - ♦ Will you restore the kingdom to us now? (Acts 1:6)
- Does Jesus answer their questions?
  - ♦ No number or specific time ever revealed to the disciples (Vs. 30, 32)
  - ♦ Time between Christ and the end described

#### Be on Your Guard

- ♦ Jesus' first command: Do not be led astray by false messiahs (Vs. 5-6)
  - ♦ The false claim: "I am Christ"
  - Many will come... and will deceive many
- ♦ Jesus' second command: Do not be alarmed (Vs. 7-8)
  - Do not be alarmed by wars and threats of coming war
  - Do not be alarmed by earthquakes and natural disasters
  - These events are decreed but are not the signs of the end
- Why should they not be alarmed?
  - These are the beginnings of the birth pangs (Vs. 8)
  - ⋄ Tribulation and trouble will increase

#### Be on Your Guard

- ♦ Jesus third command: Be on Your Guard (Vs. 9-10)
  - You are going to brought to court, beaten, and brought before kings
  - Reason for persecution: Because they hate me
  - ♦ What are we to do when this occurs? (Vs. 10)
- The first landmark: The gospel must first be preached to all nations
- ♦ Jesus fourth command: Do not be anxious for words to say (Vs. 11-13)
  - An unfailing promise: The Holy Spirit will be with you
  - ♦ The climax of persecution: Hate and Murder
- He who endures to the end will be saved

#### The Abomination of Desolation

- ♦ The sign of imminent peril (Vs. 14a)
  - ♦ When you see him... standing where he ought not. (Matt. 24:15: The holy place)
  - ♦ This is not the sign of Christ's coming (Vs. 4, Matt. 24:3)
- ♦ The correct response: Flee (Vs. 14b-18)
  - Primarily aimed towards those in Judea
  - Do not delay even for a moment
- ♦ The reason to flee: The greatest tribulation in history (Vs. 19)
- God's merciful response: Shortened the time of trouble
- ♦ God's repeated warning: Be on your guard (Vs. 20-23)

#### Daniel's Abomination of Desolation

- And after threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off, but not for himself: and the people of the prince that shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary; and the end thereof shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined. And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate.
- Three entities in this Prophecy
- Three actions of the coming prince

- Daniel's sequence of events
  - ♦ Messiah cut off City destroyed Desolation of the Prince

#### The Abomination of Desolation

- What events are being referred to in this section?
  - The destruction of Jerusalem by Titus and the Roman army in 70 AD
    - ♦ Not to be excluded from Christ's intended message. (Luke 21:20)
    - Not the intended meaning here
- How to know if you are currently in the great Tribulation
  - ♦ 2 Thess. 2: 3-4 Man of sin being worshipped in the temple
    - ♦ Dan. 9:27, 12:11: Offering taken away and the abomination set up
- Who is this warning intended for?
- ♦ The Great Tribulation: trouble intensified, but not changed in nature

## The Coming of Christ

- ♦ When will this occur? (Vs. 24, Matt. 24: 29)
- ♦ The events preceding His coming (Vs. 24-25)
  - ♦ Sun and moon will be darkened (Rev. 8:12)
  - ♦ Stars will be falling from heaven (Rev. 6:13)
- ♦ The Coming of Christ (Vs. 26-27)
  - ♦ In power and glory
  - ♦ Visible to all men (Matt. 24: 27,30)
  - With his angels and Saints... to gather together his saints

### Signs and Preparation

- ♦ The sign of the Fig Tree (Vs. 28-29)
  - What do leaves indicate?
  - When you see these events taking place... What do they indicate?
- Who does Jesus mean by 'this generation'? (Vs. 30)
  - Ourrent people living in Israel? The people living in the latter days?
- Two Questions Answered (Vs. 30-32)
- ⇒ Be on your guard and keep awake (Vs. 32-37).
  - Actions required by this command
    - Earnestly watch and wait for his coming so that we can welcome him
    - ♦ Love and serve each other. Live holy lives in Christ (Matt. 24:48-50)
