♦ The Psalm's doxology: Psalm 146 – Psalm 150

- ♦ Thanksgiving Vs. Praise Psalms
  - ♦ "He delivered them from their distress" (Ps. 107:6)
  - ⋄ "The Lord lifts up those who are bowed down." (Ps. 146:8)

# Psalm 146

- ♦ A call to Praise the LORD (vs. 1-2)
  - Praise the Lord from your soul
  - Praise the Lord continually
- ♦ Do not trust in men (vs. 3-4)
  - ♦ Reason 1: Men do not possess salvation
    - ♦ Salvation only comes from God (Ps. 3:8, Hos. 13:4)
  - ♦ Reason 2: Man's days are short

## Psalm 146

- ♦ Put your trust in God (vs. 5-10)
  - ♦ The Lord is the powerful creator of all things (vs. 6a)
  - ♦ The Lord is faithful eternally (vs. 6b)
  - ♦ The Lord executes justice (vs. 7a)
  - ♦ The Lord brings salvation (vs. 7b-8)
  - ♦ The Lord guards the helpless (vs. 9)
- ♦ Two contrasts in Ps. 146
  - Hope in God rather than men
  - God's works to the righteous and to sinners

### Psalm 147

- ♦ The Lord's first work: He brings His people home (vs. 1-6)
  - ♦ He restores His people (vs. 2)
  - ♦ He forgives His people (vs. 3)
  - ♦ Contrast: The Lord exalts the humble (vs. 6)
- ♦ The Lord's second work: He sustains His creation (vs. 7-11)
  - ♦ Contrast: The Lord takes pleasure in His people (vs. 11)
- ♦ The Lord's third work: He builds up His people (vs. 12-20)
  - ♦ He shows goodness to His people (vs. 13-14)
  - ♦ He reveals himself to His people (vs. 19)
  - Contrast: The Lord uniquely guides His people (vs. 20)
